This workshop is designed to increase the understanding on the importance of preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species through discussion and hands-on activities promoting clean, drain, dry practices.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Three units include: Public Engagement, Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Identification, and Watercraft Inspection.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT:

Participants will understand best practices for meaningful interactions for AIS spread prevention, learn effective communication strategies, receive updates on NYS rules and regulations, and get insight on data collection measures.

AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES IDENTIFICATION:

Participants will understand the impacts of AIS by learning their characteristics. View key anatomical features of aquatic plants that assist with identification and learn how these organisms are impacting the ecosystem.

WATERCRAFT INSPECTION:

Participants will practice inspecting watercraft and equipment.

AUDIENCE:

Lake associations, municipalities, nonprofits, service organizations, and youth groups.

2-3hrs.
